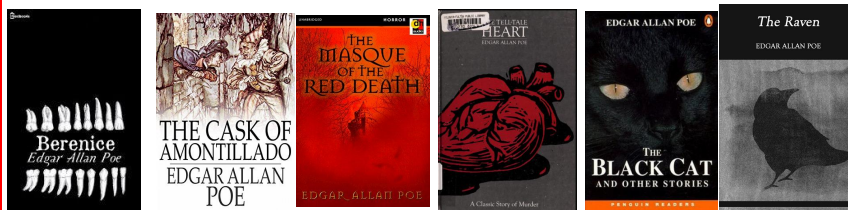

WHAT ARE YOU READING FOR OCTOBER?!



It is October! As everyone starts decorating for Halloween, it is a great time to start reading or listening to scary books. Edgar Allan Poe was an American author who wrote short stories and poems. He is best known for his tales of mystery and the macabre! All six of the titles above are available as free e-books in Project Gutenberg (click on the book cover above), free audiobooks on Librivox (click on the links below), and in the library as a print book that can be checked out! Our recommendation is definitely audiobook!

In [*The Tell-Tale Heart*](#) the narrator commits a murder and tries to convince the reader that he is sane.

In [*The Masque of the Red Death*](#), a Prince tries to avoid a plague by hiding out in an abbey & having a party.

[*The Black Cat*](#) is similar to *The Tell-Tale Heart*, but this time the victim is a cat.

[*The Raven*](#) is a poem where a talking raven flies in a window and annoyingly answers every question with "Nevermore."

[*The Cask of Amontillado*](#) is about a man taking fatal revenge on a friend who, he believes, has insulted him.

Finally, [*Berenice*](#) is about a young man who lives with his cousin who is suffering from a degenerative disease. All he can focus on is her teeth!

Be sure to let us know which book is the scariest!

RESULTS!

Congratulations to Nathan Yates, Bobbi Florence, Madi Meade, Jared Stanley, & Cooper Rolph—our 2024 Summer Reading Challenge winners! We had 43 participants this year: 17 KCU students, 18 Faculty/Staff members, and 8 KCU Alumni. We read a total of 655 books between May 1st and September 5th. We read over 200 more books than last year!
