Kentucky Christian University is now offering a completely online **Elementary Education Teacher** Degree (for Kentucky residents). 



NEW COACHES READY TO CHANGE LIVES

JASON AUBRY | Head Football Coach

Jason Aubry's coaching career began in 1999 at Woodland High School in Streator, IL, where he increased the numbers of the beginning program by over 300% in his three-year tenure. Since then, Aubry has coached at several high schools, including Joliet West High School where he led the Tigers to their first-ever appearance in the Illinois Class 8A playoffs. Jason also coached at Concordia University Chicago. Apart from his on-field accomplishments, Aubry's efforts to improve the academic performance of his players have also been impressive. From 2010-2017, he produced 23 All-State Academic players and raised the football team's graduation rate to 98% (100% in the final five years). Aubry plans to develop football players who have a life plan to become Christian leaders. Aubry was on the Overseer Board and was a member of the worship team at SouthField Church for multiple years in the Chicagoland area. Coach Aubry says, "There is something very special about Kentucky Christian University, and I am extremely excited to be part of the KCU family!"

RUSS CASSIDY | Volleyball Coach

Russ Cassidy brings a wealth of experience to his new role, having served as KCU's Volleyball Assistant Coach and Recruiting Coordinator for the past three years. Cassidy also served as the Assistant Coach for the KCU Softball team for the same period. Prior to joining KCU, Cassidy was the Ashland Middle School Softball Head Coach and Ashland Paul Blazer High School Assistant Coach. He graduated from Eastern Kentucky University with a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism and Political Science Minor in 1990. Cassidy was a member of the EKU Men's Club Volleyball Team, and he also worked as a sports writer for The Times Tribune in Corbin, KY, covering the 1990 National League Playoffs and World Series, Union College, Cumberland University, and local high school sports.

TOM POSEY | Men's & Women's Golf Coach

Tom has been an assistant baseball coach for KCU for the past five years and was on the first varsity football staff in 2007. Currently, Tom is a regional scout for the Chicago Cubs and Camp Instructor for the Cincinnati Reds youth. As a Christian he has always sought to help student athletes of all levels to navigate life through using their faith and their strengths. Coach Posey states that his job description as a coach gives him the opportunity to interact with his athletes in a way that will guide them spiritually. The goal is to compete in a manner that glorifies God and not ourselves.

MARK RITCHHART | Softball Coach

Ritchhart comes to KCU after coaching at NCAA DII Union University this past year where he was a first-time assistant in his career after 27 years as a head coach. Prior to his year at Union he was the head softball coach at Bryan College for five years. He was named the 2022 Appalachian Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as he led the team to its first AAC Conference title. He also took the team to the National Tournament where they defeated the #6 ranked team and led the program to an historic season, tallying 31 wins.

TIM VEACH | Track & Field/Cross Country Coach

Tim Veach holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from Indiana Wesleyan University. He recently retired from the US Coast Guard as a Lieutenant having served 20 years. Coach Veach's main focus over the next four years is to double the team size every year. He wants to focus his recruitment efforts on counties that rarely get looked at for KCU sports and give every student athlete who desires to run in college an opportunity. For the upcoming Track season, Coach Veach has assembled a loaded team and hopes to finish top 3 in the AAC Conference meet and the NCCAA National Championships. His favorite Bible Verse is Ephesians 4:32.

The KCU Baseball team qualified for the NCCAA Baseball Regional Tournament, hosted by Asbury. The Knights went into the tournament as the 3rd seed and finished 2nd in the region. Head Coach Jason Stowers stated, "Playing in the NCCAA Regional Tournament was a great experience for the team. We were just one inning away from making the National Tournament." Evan Juniper was selected for the NCCAA All-American Second Team while Yan Rivera made the NCCAA All-American Third Team.

Proving themselves with excellence off the field, Evan Juniper, Cameron Marushi, Tucker Sorenson, and Jacob Wiersma were selected as NCCAA Scholar-Athletes. To qualify for the NCCAA Scholar-Athlete Award, the recipients were required to be a junior, senior, or graduate student with a cumulative GPA of 3.40 or above.





The KCU Lady Knights Softball team had another great season and were ranked in the NCCAA, as high as 5th nationally. They went into the NCCAA Regional Tournament ranked 1st. Due to injuries, the team was limited and did not finish the tournament as they had hoped. "The ladies were amazing to watch all season. How they played together and for each other was inspirational. They didn't just achieve great things on the field; they also did great in the classroom with a team GPA of a 3.41," said KCU Athletic Director David Manning.

Nine Lady Knights received NCCAA Scholar-Athlete awards: Mallory Alford, Emma Ball, Ashton Blackburn, Victoria Breckler, Caroline Donithan, Riley Holtsclaw, Kaytlin Leyvas, Acie Prince, and Erica Vain. We're proud of the success of our student-athletes on and off the field.
